Public Health Orders Lifted

As of June 2, 2021, all public health orders in Dane County have been lifted in recognition of the latest [CDC guidance](#), Dane County's outstanding [vaccination rate](#), and our currently low [average number of daily cases](#).

Even without public health orders on June 2, there are some requirements for your site and some recommendations you may voluntarily implement.

Requirements for Childcare Sites on June 2 and Beyond

Child care centers must report positive cases to Public Health Madison & Dane County by calling the Communicable Disease Nurse on-call line at (608) 266-4821 or [filling out this survey online](#).

Recommendations for Childcare Sites on June 2 and Beyond

CDC and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services strongly recommends children and adults (regardless of vaccination status) in child care programs continue mask wearing and social distancing indoors until younger age groups are eligible for vaccination this summer and later this year.
