Public Health Orders Lifted

As of June 2, 2021, all public health orders in Dane County have been lifted in recognition of the latest [CDC guidance](#), Dane County's outstanding [vaccination rate](#), and our currently low [average number of daily cases](#).

Even without public health orders on June 2, there are some requirements for your school and some recommendations you may voluntarily implement.

Requirements for Schools on June 2 and Beyond

Schools must report positive cases to Public Health Madison & Dane County by reporting through WEDSS or by calling the Communicable Disease Nurse on-call line at (608) 266-4821.

Recommendations for Schools on June 2 and Beyond

- Schools are encouraged to follow contact tracing, quarantine, and isolation protocols in DHS' [school outbreak guidance](#). The current Public Health Madison & Dane County [School Action Plan](#) and [Exclusion Chart](#) include all relevant information, so schools are encouraged to continue using these resources.
- In accordance with [CDC](#), [Department of Health Services](#), and Department of Public Instruction guidance, we also strongly encourage schools to continue to require physical distancing and wearing masks at school, especially indoors and on the school bus.
- We recommend encouraging parents, school staff, and eligible children to get vaccinated as soon as possible. Continue to reiterate where people can get vaccinated or reach out to us if you are interested in hosting a community pop-up clinic. Vaccinating the adults who spend time with children younger than 12 will help protect those children.
