Ensuring Compliance with Tobacco Age Restrictions

Wisconsin WINS decreases youth's access to tobacco products.

- We conduct unannounced tobacco and nicotine compliance checks at retailers selling these products. During compliance checks, an underage person will attempt to purchase tobacco and/or nicotine products from the retailer, even if the business is intended for only adults (e.g. liquor stores, bars, tobacco shops).
- We use positive reinforcement to create healthier communities by congratulating clerks who don't sell tobacco to youth and educating those who do.
- All retailers should only sell to people 21 and older. According to federal laws, people must be 21 years old



to purchase tobacco/nicotine products. Wisconsin is one of only 8 states that has not passed a state Tobacco 21 law. This causes confusion among retailers, the public, and law enforcement.

Flavored tobacco is marketed toward young people.

- The most common product purchased by our youth inspectors are flavored tobacco products, like little cigars/cigarillos, vapes, nicotine pouches, and chewing tobacco.
- **Tobacco companies' market flavored products to young people.** Studies show that 90% of teens would not use a non-flavored nicotine product.
